 - Have 3 scenarios: Increase, decrease, maintain status quo (or similar)
 - Develop up to 3 pro and 3 con BRIEF statements for each scenario

For example . . . Taxes on Business Activity

• State currently collects about \$215 million in taxes such as corporate income taxes, charitable gaming, and insurance premium taxes.

Scenarios:

- 1. Increase taxes by 20%
 - Pro: Businesses benefit from the state having a healthy economy, so they should pony up more revenue

Result: +\$43 million

Result: No change

Result: - \$21 million

- Con: Business pass increased taxes on to customers, so Alaskans will end up paying more
- 2. Keep taxes the same
 - Pro: Stability is important to businesses, especially right now
 - Con: Alaska has a serious problem and no group should expect to not pay more
- 3. Decrease taxes by 10%
 - Pro: Businesses need a break and reducing their costs can help
 - Con: State has a serious revenue problem and can't afford to roll back taxes
